# Message from the President

At our Annual General Meeting in April, we voted to increase the trail use fee and the membership fee. We felt it necessary due the large expense of our new groomer and the price of fuel. The new fee schedule appears on page two.

Our other good news is that we have signed a ten year agreement with the Ministry of Forests regarding the use of the trails on Mount MacPherson, which is in effect our license of occupation.

As always, we thank our trail crew, the corner stones of our club. Al McInnes, Mickey Olsen, and Brian Abear worked hard to find a groomer. They were also instrumental in getting the upgrades to the trail system laid out and constructed. The Forest Service looked after some of the installation costs and repair work at the trailhead kiosk and the Ole Sandberg cabin.

Graham and Wendy Harper have again graciously allowed us to store the groomer at MacPherson Lodge. That kind of security is highly appreciated.



#### Club Acquires New (Used) Groomer

After an extensive search by Brian Abear, the club has purchased a replacement trail grooming machine, a 2002 Bombardier BR275 with 5672 hours on the clock. Our previous machine was 24 years old and was expensive and difficult to maintain.


Our relatively new groomer has been refurbished with new hydraulic hoses, drive sprockets, and 58 inch semi-closed profile tracks. The new tracks are the most important maintenance item on the unit. The tractor will be 20 cm wider than our previous machine and the tiller will be 30 cm wider. Also included are new tracksetters and X-C combs on the tiller flaps. This comb is finer than the traditional downhill ski area type and is the same as what is used on the Sovereign Lake trails.

The new groomer will work faster and is expected to use less fuel per track setting session. It comes with a year and a half left on the Cummins engine warranty. All of the replaced parts have a 90 day warranty, while the hydraulic pumps will have a one year warranty.

The cost was \$101,121.00. This included taxes, delivery to Revelstoke, and our old groomer as a trade-in. Brand new machines like this cost in excess of \$250,000.00.

The club is able to afford such a purchase because of the farsightedness of previous boards of directors who stashed money specifically for this purpose over an eight year period.

Also, we applied for contributions from funding agencies, which made it possible to purchase a much newer machine than we could otherwise afford. A list of funders will be published in our next newsletter. Our thanks to Karen Bray for shepherding these applications.

## Trail Upgrading Continues

Al McInnes, on behalf of the club, constructed a cut-off trail from BCIT to Loggers Lane in order to eliminate two-way traffic on MacPherson Access. This will eliminate the need of having two-way traffic on the steep hill on BCIT.

Also, work has been done in a number of areas on the trail system-widening and installing culverts. The Ministry of Forests has committed to replacing the bridge at the Beaver Dam with a fish friendly culvert and to replacing a collapsed wooden culvert on Cedar Ramble with a steel pipe. These improvements should allow for more stable trail conditions in times of mild or wet weather.

Logs from the trail clearing were used to widen bridges on Creek Crawl, BCIT trail, and Cedar Ramble. Profits from the sale of the remaining logs paid for the use of the logging equipment and stumpage, with funds left over. We were fortunate to receive a number of used culverts from Revelstoke Community Forest Corporation, Downie Timber Ltd. and the Forest Service.

The annual brushing work parties took place on September 24 and October 1. If you want to know about these types of activities so you can volunteer in the fall, make sure you put an email address on your membership form. Diana Graham is great at getting out these messages to us.
