 - a. Motion to increase number of Directors on the Executive from 9 to 11

In order that we have up to 11 directors and keep about half of the directors changing each year, a change is required of the By-Laws as follows:

Section 21 c) currently says:

- c) There shall be a **maximum of 9** directors.

The wording should be changed to

- c) There shall be a **maximum of 11** directors.

Section 22 b) currently reads:

- b) The directors shall be divided into two groups composed of four directors in each group. At the first annual general meeting following the adoption of this clause those four directors elected with the highest number of votes shall be elected for a two year term; those four having the next highest number of votes shall be elected for a one year term. In the case of directors having an equal number of votes the term of the directors shall be determined by a draw. The term of office of each group of directors duly elected at subsequent annual meetings shall be for two years. The members at an annual general meeting may decide to elect one additional director for a one year term provided that only 9 directors are in office at any one time.

The wording should be changed to:

b) **The term of office of each director shall be 2 years.**

President's Report

What a ski season we have had and continue to have! In addition to the great skiing we have had, it has also been a note worthy year on a number of different fronts. Our club membership has climbed to a record high of 492 members (I had hoped we would break the 500 member mark but maybe next year). We hired our first full time coach/Lodge Custodian – Andrei Pascu, introduced many new programs including Masters Ski group, Ski clinics, private coached ski lessons, Mom and Tots ski group ,and a new Skool Ski program. In addition our grooming crew now has 11 members on its roster. The groomers put in a record number of hours to ensure our trails were and continue to be groomed on a regular and timely basis. The Team Scream had the most teams ever enter the event, the Lantern Ski used Mickey's Loop and the Day Lodge to be the centre of activities, and the George Grey (ex-national cross country ski team member) ski workshop weekend was a huge success. Thank you to all of the many club volunteers who made this long list of accomplishments happen. Were it not for the dedication and commitment of our club volunteers, none of this would have happened.

Our plans for the upcoming summer include the replacement of two trail bridges (Creek Crawl and BCIT), building a new open side foot roofed structure to store the Ginzu Groomer and other attachments during the winter months, and a minor trail re-route of BCIT to avoid the steep curve. We will have our annual trail brushing work party sometime in the early fall.

Next year, Cross Country BC has offered the club the opportunity to host the BC Midget Cross Country Ski Championships. This event draws approximately 150 – 200 young skiers and their families for a weekend of fun races and events in early March of 2013. As an Executive, we have accepted this offer and look forward with enthusiasm to hosting this event that will give our Club the opportunity to showcase our excellent ski trails and facilities to skiers from across the province.

Finally, our Annual General Meeting is scheduled for April 16th, 7PM at the Day Lodge. We hope you will be able to attend the AGM to hear reports from the Executive, participate in the election of new Directors, raise any questions or concerns you may have, and have one last opportunity to socialize with club members this season.

Net Income

Special Projects such as purchasing the snowmobile, Ginzu groomer attachment, timing equipment and race bibs were substantially funded by donations. The remaining difference of \$7,968 was paid from the club accounts.

Operational Net Income (not including Special Projects) was \$6,274.

Net Income for 2012 season was the Operational Net Income minus the club contribution for the Special Projects = \$6274 - \$7968 = -\$1693

Assets

Club assets decreased by \$1693 from \$41,678.11 to \$39,986. This decrease was offset by capital purchases of the ski doo, ginzu groomer attachment, and race timing equipment totalling \$18,459.

For the Trail Construction Funds, of the \$77,000 there is \$39,898 remaining

I haven't had any luck in attracting other para nordic skiers to the program but it's a first step. I have two sit skis to return to Canmore. If anyone is heading that way I would appreciate assistance in returning the equipment as I don't get over there much. Thank you. I have a nice collection of poles and two sets of skis that I will use to start up again next season. Emily Suchy finished her first season as a competitive sit skier. She reached her goals for the season and became the first ever sit skier to earn a medal at the BC Winter Games. Emily also just competed in Golden where she won her first medal against an all able bodied category! What a great way to wrap up our season.

Ski League Report

Once again, the Revelstoke Nordic Ski Club's Ski League has held a successful season. Although our overall numbers were down slightly from previous years (76 children, down from 91 last year), after five years of steady growth a slight dip in enrolment is no cause for alarm. By groups the numbers were 17 Bunnies (ages 4 – 6), 24 Rabbits (ages 7 – 9), 14 Track Attack (10 – 12) and 12 Junior Development (13+). In addition, this year a new group was developed for kids 10 and older who did not want to compete. Dubbed the Trail Blazers, this highly successful group had nine eager participants who learned a variety of skills such as fire-making, winter survival and avalanche awareness in addition to their Nordic training. Thanks to the dedication of coaches Ian Brown and Rory Luxmoore, we look forward to being able to offer this non-competitive stream in the future.

This season was an historic one for our ski league because we hired our first professional coach. Due to a variety of challenges, mostly involving the byzantine process of hiring foreign workers, Andrei Pascu was not able to join us until near the end of December. Despite the late start on the season, Andrei has embraced the club and his new charges, and we are very pleased that he will join us again for the 2012 – 13 season. We look forward to having his leadership from September through the entire winter, and anticipate even more growth in our competitive groups under his guidance.

We were able to afford a coach through due a significant increase in registration fees for the competitive groups of Track Attack and Junior Development. In addition we applied for and received a BC Gaming Grant of \$11,000 which helped to offset operational costs of the program. We intend to apply for a Gaming Grant again this summer. We will also be starting the hiring process much sooner, as we were quite surprised by the complexities and length of time it took last year.

Ski League is very grateful to the many volunteer coaches who donate their time and energy to the children's program. This year, Rabbit coaches were: Janette Vickers, Kevin Bollefor, Madeleine Martin-Preney, Matt Smider, Angus Woodman, Ian Brown and Rory Luxmoore. Bunny coaches were Kendra Von Bremen, Eleanor Wilson, Sylvia Woods and Clara Suchy. Bruce Granstrom, who has led the Track Attack group for the past two years, now volunteers as an assistant to head coach Andrei Pascu.

Other highlights:

- We ran an Introduction to Community Coaching course in November, and an Introduction to Training course in January and March (classroom and on-snow sections, respectively)
- We paid for former-National Team member and Olympian George Grey to come for a weekend in February, where he skied with all levels, led clinics on training and nutrition, and gave an excellent evening presentation.

Junior Development Report

The Race Program got underway with Revelstoke once again holding the Regional Camp. The streets of Revelstoke were taken over by 62 rollerskiing campers during the last weekend of September. Dryland was begun and saw the athletes rollerskiing, running, biking and performing strength exercises. With early season snow we were able to get onto snow by November 15th and start preparing for the first race of the season. Revelstoke Racers were represented at the first two NorAms which were held in December. A training block was held over Christmas and we welcomed our new coach at the end of December. January was started with a BCWG qualifying race which saw Revelstoke qualify 4 racers to go to the BCWG. Revelstoke also had qualified its first paranordic athlete to attend the BCWG in December. Small contingents of athletes attended both the Callaghan Valley and Prince George BC cup races. A larger contingent of racers were present at the BC Championships that were held in Salmon Arm. Revelstoke was also represented at the BCWG and the BC Midget Championships. Finally two athletes from Revelstoke attended the Canadian Cross Country Ski Championships in Mt St Anne, Que. Thanks to Sally Thomson for keeping the program running while waiting for the coach to arrive.

Head Coach Andrei Pascu 2011/12 Annual Report

From my perspective as Head Coach of Revelstoke Nordic Ski Club, the Cross Country Skiing Season that just ended had three major components: Masters' Program, Ski S'Kool Program and the Racing Program.

The Masters' Program started on January 10th and ended on March 15th and was attended by a number of 32 members. The sessions were held on Tuesdays from 6,30PM for a group of 24 and Thursdays from 1PM for a group of 8. We have worked alternatively one week for classic and one week for skating technique. It was a hard job both for the members and the coach because it is difficult to change the "bad habits" of adults... But the hard work paid off: at the end of the program I have seen a big improvement for the intermediate level and good technical skills learned by the beginners: it was clear that all of them ski easier, glide longer, doing less effort and feeling more comfortable on their skis. Based also on the feedback I had from the participants, I can say this program was a success.

The Ski S'Kool Program was also a big success for the Revelstoke Nordic Ski Club! This program was delivered for the Grades 4 from Columbia Park Elementary School, Mountain View Elementary School, Mt. Begbie Elementary School and Arrow Heights Elementary School with a total number of 65 participants. Each school had a number of 5 sessions with a total of 10 hrs. on snow for each school group. This program was a success for the Club not only because there were a lot of kids who discovered cross country skiing and enjoyed the outdoor classes... From my point of view it was a success also because we had the chance to meet some very skilled children who were "inoculated" with the "cross country skiing virus" and we will try to get them all next winter in our Jackrabbit Program. For this successful program we have to thank to all the teachers, the parents (some of them members of Revelstoke Nordic) and the volunteer coaches who made this program possible. And a special thanks to Sally Thomson who's energy and joy made us "change the gears" and enjoy more every Thursday morning!

The Racing Program was my major goal for this winter. When I arrived in Revelstoke I have found 4 programs running: Bunnies, Jackrabbits, Track Attack and Junior Development. I put the Bunnies and the Jackrabbits together with the other two groups because I consider them as being not only a part of a Racing Program but maybe one of the most important parts of such a program. At this level you put the basis for the future athletes, you put the basis of their technical skills and, most of all, you make the children LOVE the sport called cross country skiing. I was happy to see the passion and the commitment of the coaches who worked with the Bunnies and Jackrabbits. I want to thank them all for their excellent job: every Saturday, seeing your passion, I felt reinforced! Thank you all!

I know that the first weeks were tough for both Track Attack and Junior Development. I know how tough it is to change the coach: a total stranger comes and takes the place of someone you know for such a long time, of someone you care for, of someone with whom you shared a lot of good and bad moments of your life... I know it is tough, it happened to me also... As tough as it was for the other coaches who had to step back slowly and let me take over... I know it was tough, it happened to me sometime... But I promise you it was very tough for me also: new people, new culture (so different from all the other cultures I've known), new way of thinking about sports (so different from Europe)... It was tough...

But as George Grey said: tough times don't last! And they didn't last because of you: your warm welcoming, your hospitality, your openness and willingness to try new things... You helped me feel like home! You made

me fell welcomed! You made me feel very quickly as being a part of your community! And for all these I thank you all!

My first thought for the Racing Program was that we need a Racing Team: for this the first step was to unify the training sessions for the Track Attack and Junior Development. It was hard at the beginning due to age differences but slowly we have seen that the relation between older and younger athletes gets stronger and stronger. I was happy to see them becoming real team mates and building up friendships.

The second step was to increase the number of training sessions. Again, the beginning was hard but slowly the athletes got used to the idea that winning means more hours of training. The same happened with the training load: starting with easy training sessions we've got in the point where I had to increase the intensity and I had to explain a lot why we are doing it... Finally all the athletes started to understand my principles of training, they started to understand why and when we work on "volume", why and when we work on "intensity", what are the differences between the training zones and many other things.

Looking at the training attendance in the period January-March I can tell you that the average number is 100 hours of training and racing: the leaders are Miika Park (131 hours), Alana Brittin (127 hours), Elizabeth Elliot and Calum Gribbon (118 hours). All the other Racing Team members have between 80 and 112 hours of training, the less being Bronte Visnaugh (50 hours) and Hanna Thomson (34 hours). The toughest month was February when 17 racers had a number of over 20 days of training and racing, the leaders being Miika Park (24 days) and Gina Cinelli, Tayla Koerber and Beth Granstrom (23 days)...

I am sure that now all of them know what to expect in the next winter season. Regarding the on-snow training I can say that all the athletes are aware now of how they have to train during a racing season if they want to win...

For this first season I had no goals put by the club, but I have established some goals of my own: to get medals and top 10 standings at the BC Cup, BC Championships, Western Canadian Championships and BC Midget Championships.

And the hard work of our athletes paid off: Revelstoke Nordic Racing Team had a lot of good results in the major events of the winter.

Even if they had some other major commitments, even if they had their own individualized training plans and they trained just time to time with the rest of our Racing Team, I want first of all to congratulate from all my heart the Evans' siblings: Megan Evans for winning Gold, Silver and Bronze medals at the Canadian National Championships, Gold in the Western Canadian Championships and Gold in the BC Championships; Brittany Evans who even if she was not in her best health, her efforts paid off and succeeded to win a National Bronze medal, among the Gold in Western Canadian Championships and Gold in BC Championships; and Rhys Evans with his Gold in Western Canadian Championships and Gold and Bronze in BC Winter Games. These results made Revelstoke Nordic Ski Club to be known far beyond the provincial frontiers... All three of them have proved once again their talent and I hope they will decide to continue with cross country skiing...

Regarding the athletes who did their training totally in our Racing Program please let me present to you the rest of our Racing Team for the 2011/2012 Winter Season:

- Hanna Thomson - relay BC Champion, BC Cup Overall Winner... a born talent: even she trained the less than everybody else still did some excellent races!

- Bronte Viznaugh - relay BC Champion, she won this year her first individual medals at the BC Cup race in Prince George.
- Gina Cinelli - bronze in the BC Winter Games.
- Tayla Koerber - tremendous progress during the winter, excellent technical classic skier.
- Emily Suchy - Western Canadian Champion, BC Winter Games Champion, BC Champion, one of the most determined athlete I've ever coached in my life.
- Kellen Viznaugh - a huge progress, closing up with the leaders of his age group and very close to the podium in a couple of races...
- Daniel Blackie - improving day by day his technique and his results, he won his first ever individual medals at the BC Cup in Prince George.
- Alana Brittin - the leader of the "new generation", first ever two BC Champion titles and two silver medals at BC Midgets Championships.
- Beth Granstrom - relay BC Champion and two silver medals at BC Midgets Championships, first ever medals in cross country skiing.
- Elizabeth Elliot - relay BC Champion and silver relay BC Midgets Championships, first ever medals in cross country skiing.
- Kate Granstrom - silver relay BC Midgets Championships.
- Miika Park - top 10 at BC Midgets Championships, excellent technical progress and the leader in the training hours - 131 hours of training from January to April.

Dog Trail & Users Report

Beginning in November monthly dog loop updates were emailed to all the registered Doggers. The total is now ninety six email addresses which includes 131 RNSC members and around 80 dogs.

As a group the Doggers would like to see a few changes to make the RNSC dog loop even better. The four areas are

1. Decreasing dog/ skiers collisions
2. Keeping Macpherson beautiful
3. Better signage
4. Additional dog friendly skiing

A few changes would move us toward achieving these goals.

At the entrance to the dog loop, near the new sign and highway, a sign is requested describing the expected skier etiquette, a map of the loop, the location of the pay vault, dogger responsibilities, the location of the waste can (behind the lodge) and a warning that dogs may be encountered.

A "hitching post" near this same area would provide a secure, sturdy place to clip your dog while getting organized. Kevin and I have discussed some possible sites and designs.
