As many of you know, the Club will be hosting the 2013 Teck Midget Championships on March 2nd and 3rd. This event draws skiers ages 10 to 13 from across BC for a memorable and enjoyable weekend of cross country competition and fun!

We anticipate that between 160 and 225 skiers and their

families will converge on Revelstoke for this event. Hosting this event requires the assistance of many volunteers (see article inside about how to volunteer). A free shuttle bus service will be available to all skiers. The old Shell bulk plant adjacent to HMC highway contractor will be ploughed for vehicle parking. This will be the location to catch the shuttle bus. More information will be provided to club members as the event approaches.

As you will have noticed, the parking lot has become more congested than ever before with vehicles. This is in part due to the ever increasing popularity of the "Fingers" area for ski touring. The end result is that we are currently investigating options to increase the amount of parking spaces available for club members, ski tourers/snow shoers and members of the public. Skiing with your dog


Hello fellow club members.

The Team Scream Ski Relay race will be held this year on Saturday February 9, 2013 at the Mt Macpherson Ski Trails. Registration is from 9:30 to 10:30 with the race starting at 11:00. The format for the tandem race is the same as previous years with two skiers, one classic and one freestyle, each skiing a lap around the Mickey Olson Loop. The best combined time in each category wins. This year we are also including the category of individual pursuit where one skier does both the classic and freestyle laps themselves.



The emphasis for this race is on participation and FUN so

get a partner or get organized to do it yourself and come out to enjoy the fun. If you can't find a partner come out to watch or we'll help match you with a partner.

A prize will be awarded for the best costume. This year, the theme for costumes is Starwars so designing a costume should be lots of fun; use your imagination. We expect to see lots of great costumes!

The club is providing free burgers for all participants and spectators, just to add to the fun. There is no cost for the race if you are a club member – non members pay the day rate. After the race there will be a short race for the Ski League Bunnies and other young skiers.
