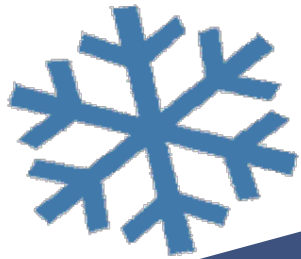

## Junior Development Racing

Sunshine and cold conditions prevailed at the Overlander Ski Area located at Stake Lake near Kamloops over the weekend of February 19/20. The Revelstoke Nordic Ski Club had a club showing of 16 athletes to battle it out with 16 other clubs from within BC. On first day event action on a hilly 5 km course using free technique, Megan Evans took 3<sup>rd</sup> overall among juvenile girls while Hanna Thomson was 5<sup>th</sup>. Rhys Evans was 6<sup>th</sup> among Midget Boys, and his sister, Brittany Evans, skied a 7.5 km course strongly finishing in 5<sup>th</sup> position.

Athletes compete for provincial aggregate awards within the BC Cup Series. Impressively, Revelstoke took the podium at the evening banquet several times receiving awards designed to recognize a consistent effort and achievement across several BC Cups. ## Team Scream

The Nordic Club held the annual Team Scream Tandem Relay Race on Saturday Feb 12 at the ski trails on Mt Macpherson. The event was a great success with over 80 competitors competing in a variety of categories. Road closures prevented most out of town racers from attending, though we did have several racers for Salmon Arm and a group from New Denver.

The club added two new categories this year. Twelve racers entered the new Individual Pursuit category where each racer does two loops; one lap of classic and one of skating. That creates lots of action in the stadium area as racers change skis and poles then head out for the second loop. A second category was also added this year for parents pulling their kids in a chariot. That added a new meaning of taking your kid to the races and lots of action for spectators.

The costume theme this year was Western/Cowboy so the lodge was full of cowboys, cowgirls and horses. We even had one cow show up for the event. The new day lodge was buzzing all day with racers and spectators.

The Ski Club also added a short ceremony to the day by having the Grand Opening of the new day lodge just before the start of the race. The club president Dave Kaegi gave a short speech thanking all the funding agencies, local businesses and volunteers for making the fabulous new lodge possible. Dave then cut a ribbon and declared the new lodge officially open!
