President's Message



Ski League for Children

The Revelstoke Nordic Ski Club offers the Cross Country British Columbia Ski League Program at the Mount MacPherson Trails. The sessions emphasize fun, games, and special events aimed at developing skill and fitness. The program offers three levels:

- **Bunnies:** for children age four and kindergarten (parent participation required).
- **Rabbits:** for children in grades one to six.
- Junior Development: for children in grades four and up, who have advanced skiing skills and wish to participate in ski races.

Cost: Rabbits & Jr. Development: club members - \$25 per child, non-members - \$30 per child; Bunnies - \$20 per child. Registration fees include a junior competitor license, ski poster, water bottle, fanny pack, award badges, and liability insurance.

When: Saturdays, January 8 - March 5
Hours: Bunnies 10:30 - 11:15 a.m.; Rabbits & Jr. Development 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.
Orientation: Community Centre, January 1, 10:00 -11:30 a.m.


On snow: New Year's Day Lantern Ski

After School Program: Mondays 3:45 – 5:00 p.m.. Five sessions beginning January 17 designed for children in grades 2 and up who have basic skiing technique and are interested in fine tuning skills. This is **not** an introductory program. No charge for those registered in the Ski League program. Non-members, \$25.

Groups are lead by volunteer Ski League Leaders and NCCP certified coaches. Assistance from parents, students, and club members is welcome, *regardless of skiing ability*. We can help you with your skiing and leadership abilities.

 National Community Coaching Program course for leaders: Applicable to any sport. January 7-9. Sixteen hour introductory level course on proper coaching practices. This is not about ski technique. No charge for leaders with the Ski League program. All others, \$65.
