President's Message

The end of the season is upon us. The club held a very successful Lantern Ski and Team Scream Relay fun event. Bev Clark, as usual, was the brains behind the Lantern Ski. Keith McNab and Cam Molder did an excellent job of organizing the Team Scream event. We could not have had a more perfect day! I think there is a good chance it will become and annual event.

Our Rabbit / Bunny program under the direction Sally Thomson and her crew of instructors is remarkable. I believe we have as many children enrolled in the Rabbit / Bunny program as there is in the Nancy Greene Ski League. It is very rewarding to see the ski skills of our young ones steadily improving.

The club is in the process of signing a ten year agreement with the Ministry of Forests, which will give the club authority to charge for trail use. In the new agreement the government provides liability insurance. The agreement is an integral part of the club's success.

The club is now into a major fund raising phase. Our 24-year-old Piston Bully is at the end of its serviceable life. Some of its metal components are crystallizing and breaking after many years of vibration. The club has about \$80,000.00 to put towards a new groomer. We are preparing funding applications to the Revelstoke Credit Union, the Columbia Basin Trust, and the BC Lottery Corporation. The more money we can put towards a groomer, the newer the groomer or the fewer its hours, meaning less repairs and maintenance problems. If you can think of any other source we can approach that may be interested in donating to this cause, please let New Date! someone on the club executive know.

I encourage everyone to attend our Potluck Dinner on April 24, as it is a time to acknowledge the hard work and efforts of many club members. This year we have some very special presentations for our groomers. I cannot say enough good things about our groomers or thank them enough. Did you know that they brush our trail outside the formal work parties, spend untold hours maintaining and fixing the old Piston Bully (sometimes in adverse weather conditions), and groom our trails year after year? Over the course of the year the three of them log over 2000 hours of volunteer time. The quality of skiing we all enjoy is solely the efforts of our grooming crew and it is because of their efforts we are now in a position to purchase a new machine. We cannot thank you enough, guys!
