Maintenance Facility and Stadium Area

The Maintenance facility will be located off of Mickey's Loop 75 feet away from the Day Lodge. It will be a 40x40 feet (1,600 sq. ft.) wood framed structure with 12' high walls built on a cement slab. It will have propane ceiling heat. A large work shop area will be located at the rear of the building. It will have a large garage door(28 feet wide by 10 feet tall) and a separate main door.

As part of the overall construction of the new Day Lodge and Maintenance Facility, we will also be constructing a new Stadium Area. This is a bit of a misnomer as we are not constructing what one would typically envision a stadium looks like. In the cross country skiing context, a stadium area is a large cleared (600 to 800 feet long by 100 to 200 feet wide), relatively flat area where activities such as races, children's games, ski instructional activities and special events can occur. The new stadium area at Mt MacPherson will be located west of the parking lot, south of the pit toilet, and heading south across main loop to Mickey's Loop. The Club recently received \$10,000 from the Columbia Basin Trust to assist with the development costs of the area. Ultimately we would like to see outdoor lighting installed in the Stadium Area. Depending upon the final budget, this may or may not be installed this year.









The new Day Lodge

The dream is shortly to become a reality! Thanks to the donation of \$75,000 from the Columbia Basin Trust, \$125,000 from the Economic Opportunities Fund of the Colombia Shuswap Regional District, \$175,000 for the City of Revelstoke's Tourism Infrastructure Fund, and \$50,000 from our own Nordic Club finances, the sound of heavy machinery and hammers will be ringing in the air. By early May, construction will commence on the new Day Lodge at the Mt MacPherson Cross Country Skiing trailhead parking lot. The new Lodge will be built on the south west corner of the parking lot, between Mickey's loop and Main Loop. As you can see from the attached plans, it is going to be a facility we can all be proud of for years to come. By this time next year, we will have ended our first season with the new day Lodge.

Facility Details:

- 3 storey structure
- Basement ground level walk-out (909 sq. ft of public space). Men's and women's flush washrooms, large boot changing and storage area, club waxing room, storage room
- Main Floor ground level walk out (1023 sq. ft. of public space), ticket office, full service kitchen, great room with wood pellet stove, deck access

- Top floor (706 sq. ft private apartment), 1 bedroom, full bathroom, full kitchen, living room/dining room area, external access from stairway
- Electric wall heaters augmented by wood pellet stove on main floor
- · Covered deck on three sides
- External waxing benches beneath deck on lower level

We would like to extend a huge thank you to Glen O'Riley at Selkirk Design-Works for his massive contribution to the realization of the Day Lodge. We have included drawings of the buildings interior and exterior. More information will be available at the AGM on April 27th.
